Hello Bauder families,





#### **SRO Corner**



Hello and Happy New Year Bauder Families!

I hope you all had a restful and enjoyable break with your families and loved ones. As we step into the new year, I want to address a topic that is of utmost importance to our school community – school threats. It's an unfortunate reality in today's society, and it's crucial for us to come together to ensure the safety of our students and staff.

The SRO team and PSD want to assure you that we take school threats very seriously. The safety and well-being of our students and staff are our top priorities, and we have robust measures in place to address any potential threats that may arise. Your SRO Team, in collaboration with district and school safety teams, work diligently to investigate and address any reported threats. This partnership allows us to respond swiftly and effectively to ensure the safety of our students and staff.

School threats can take various forms, and it's essential to be aware of them. Examples of school threats may include:

- 1. Verbal Threats: Expressions of intent to harm others, whether made in person, over the phone, or online.
- 2. Written Threats: Any written communication that conveys a threat to the safety of individuals within the school community.
- 3. Social Media Threats: Threatening messages, posts, or comments on social media platforms that target the school or specific individuals.
- 4. Suspicious Objects or Packages: Discovery of any items that may pose a potential threat, even if they appear harmless at first glance.
- 5. Bullying or Harassment: Persistent and targeted behaviors that create a hostile environment and may escalate into more serious threats.
- 6. Weapons Possession: Any indication that a student may be in possession of weapons on school premises.

If you come across or hear about a potential threat, we encourage you to report it promptly. You can do so through your school counselor or any other trusted adult in the school community. Open communication is key in addressing these concerns effectively.

Additionally, we have a dedicated platform called Safe2Tell where you can report any suspicious activity or information anonymously. However, we encourage you to consider reporting directly to a trusted adult, if possible, as it allows for a more direct and immediate response from our school safety team. Remember, your vigilance and cooperation play a crucial role in maintaining a safe and secure learning environment for everyone. We appreciate your commitment to the safety of our school community.
