since we came back from winter break? We've had time to settle back into routines. Our teaching staff have also had time to reflect on students' progress and make adjustments to instruction. We are really pleased with the growth our youngest learners have been making in literacy. We hope you are seeing the evidence of this at home as well. It's so exciting as they become confident, independent readers. Providing them with a dedicated time and place to practice reading each night will help them continue their upward trajectory. And, of course, being read to is super important as well. Children who are read to at least three times a week by a family member are almost twice as likely to score in the top 25% in reading compared to children who are read to less than 3 times a week. * Not only does it help your child in school, but it's also just a wonderful way to spend quality time together and bond. These days, children have so much access to devices for entertainment sometimes it's hard to pull them away, but it's very much worth the effort. Find some time to cuddle up and read together!

February is the month of the 5210 Healthy Kids Challenge. Limiting screen time, eating healthy, and getting sufficient exercise and sleep are crucial to healthy development. Exercise, nutrition, and good sleep are all important factors for a student's emotional well-being and their ability to tackle academic challenges as well. I encourage your whole family to participate in the challenge.

We have had a lot of students out recently due to sickness, including influenza, going around. We appreciate you keeping your children home when they are ill and contagious. Knowing that we will always have to miss some days due to illness, it's vital that we limit any other absences. A Healthy School Year Starts Now!

We have had an increase in illnesses this winter at our school. What's going around???



- Flu is caused by the influenza virus of Class A, B and C. Flu spreads directly or indirectly from airborne droplets produced during sneezing or coughing. It is an infection of the nose, throat and lungs. The flu is caused by a virus. Most people with the flu get better on their own. To help protect against seasonal flu, you can get an annual flu shot. Take additional steps to prevent the flu by cleaning and disinfecting surfaces, washing hands, and keeping the air around you moving.
- RSV is another highly contagious virus that spreads similarly. It can cause cold-like symptoms and is some cases lead to more serious respiratory issues such as bronchiolitis or pneumonia.
- Norovirus is a highly contagious virus that causes gastroenteritis, which is inflammation of the stomach and intestines. It is often referred to as the stomach flu. Sanitizing agents help inhibit the spread but will not kill norovirus, make sure you are doing effective and thorough handwashing. Don't share food or drinks with friends and avoid close contact with those that are sick.

We are amping up our cleaning efforts at school, but we need your help! If your student has vomiting, diarrhea, or a fever make sure they stay home until they are 24 hours free of those symptoms before returning to school. If you are having significant respiratory symptoms, consider staying home or wearing a mask. Make sure you are washing your hands frequently. If your student is officially diagnosed with a specific illness, please let the office know. By following these simple steps, we can all keep our school community safe and healthy.

PSD's Elementary Attendance Success Criteria

Common success criteria are needed for all elementary schools to ensure that the school district is accounting for young students' safety.

General Considerations:

- Parents and Guardians reporting an excused absence via phone, app or email, is evidence of student safety and no follow up is needed.
- If there is no communication from Parents and Guardians, the school must meet the success criteria.
- For the office attendance protocols to be successful, attendance must be completed by classroom teachers within the first 30 minutes of class.
- Student safety is the school's top priority, and this attendance work must take precedence over tasks.
 - The sooner a parent or guardian hears from us or vice versa, the better for student safety.

Bauder will be utilizing the School Messenger system for any absences without a reason. For students' safety we will continue to call parents, guardians and/or emergency contacts until we hear the child is safely with their families.

What can you do to help? You can report your student's absence before 9:30am. Our attendance line is available 24 hours a day, you can call and leave the reason for the absence at 970-488-4151. You can also use your ParentVue account to enter the absence. Absences can only be excused within 5 days of the date of absence. Thank you in advance for your help in keeping our students safe.



If Winter Weather Hits Hard: 2 Hour Delay Start Schedule

When PSD calls a 2 hour delay due to weather our school's daily schedule changes. You will receive a phone call, email and/or text message informing of a delayed start. We do not serve breakfast on delayed start days. District busing will be a 2hour delay from the scheduled morning pick-up time. Please note students cannot be on the school grounds until 10:45am, as there is no staff supervision before that time. School starts at 11:05am. The end of the day dismissal time is 3:43pm like a regular school day.

Bauder Mental Health Week

In collaboration with the Poudre School District Ignite Grant, Bauder's counseling and ENCORE team provided all students with tools and learning opportunities related to mental health through their ENCORE rotations (art, library, music, PE, and technology).

We focused on the following:

- 1. Big feelings are OK!
- 2. It's OK (and encouraged!) to ask for help!
- 3. Coping strategies were taught to students so if they get big feelings, they can get back to "calm" and "ready to learn".

In ART:

All students in attendance received a journal to take home so they could write, draw, or color in.

In LIBRARY:

All students in attendance received a green bracelet to take home, reminding them this is their GREEN LIGHT to ask for help and that mental health MATTERS!

In MUSIC:

All students in attendance made their own calming rain sticks to take home!

In PE:

All students in attendance received a stress ball (star) with encouraging words written on it!


In TECHNOLOGY:
