

- Compared to children with average attendance, chronically absent students gained 14% fewer literacy skills in kindergarten and 15% fewer literacy skills in 1st grade
- By 5th grade, chronic absence is one of three early warning signs that a student is more likely to drop out of school.
- Students who are chronically absent are at much greater risk of struggling academically and socially-emotionally at school.

The more regular your child's attendance, the better they will do in school and the more comfortable they will feel here. Please make consistent attendance a priority. If you need any support with getting your child here on time and consistently, please reach out and let us know.

## **PSD Student Health Portal**

Cases of influenza, COVID-19, RSV, and other illnesses are often more likely to spread during the winter months, when more of us are indoors and in close

proximity to one another. PSD has created a new online Student Health Portal to submit positive Covid-19 test results. This is totally optional, but it is a great way to communicate positive cases and receive return/masking dates and isolation instructions. This is designed to save families and staff time previously spent on the phone. If you would prefer, calling the school attendance line or health office is still an option. When you enter the date that Covid symptoms first started, our system will tell you the date that your student may return to school. At this time, the Student Health Portal is for entry of positive COVID cases only. ## **CMAS Testing Information**

Our Mathematics (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>), English Language Arts (3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>), and Science (5<sup>th</sup>) Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) tests will be held during the month or April. Specifically, students will test with the following schedule:

The entire body of evidence—class assignments, formative and summative assessments, and projects—paints a clearer picture of student progress. #### **Read to Feed**

Who helps families in need by reading books? Bauder Bucks do! Ms. Repetto and Ms. Bright's second graders worked really hard to read as many pages and books as they could for the entire month of





January in an effort to raise money for impoverished families across the globe! Students participated in Heifer International's reading incentive program called "Read to Feed".

Second graders pooled their efforts and coins and combined the two classes raised \$871.89 by reading books! Students then learned about the ways in which farm animals, irrigation systems, and tree saplings helped families pull themselves out of poverty. Students voted on items to purchase with their funds. Combined, second graders who participated in this project purchased from Heifer International two irrigation systems for two villages, 7 flocks of chickens for seven families, two beehives for women's empowerment projects, one water buffalo to help plow rice fields and provide nourishing milk to malnourished children and families, and one pig for a family in need. Second graders at Bauder turned thousands of pages, literally, during the month of January for this effort! Little hands can change the world!

## **Attention 5th Grade Families**



Colorado law requires students who are entering sixth grade to receive a tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) vaccine before their first day of school. While the Tdap vaccine is typically given at age 11 for students who are entering sixth grade, it may also be given as early as 10

years of age. When it is given at age 10, it will:

1) Count as a valid adolescent Tdap dose, and 2) meet Colorado's sixth grade Tdap school vaccine requirement.

If your child does not receive Tdap vaccine at sixth-grade entry, regardless of their age, a certificate of medical or nonmedical exemption must be submitted to the school. This will ensure your student is compliant with Colorado school immunization law and able to attend middle school.
